

## Death, Immortality, and Heaven: No. 11

### Hanging Threads

Maybe I have dragged this topic out too long, but many traditional literal misconceptions are entrenched so deeply that much corrective restudy is in order. The fabric of expectations of a literal end of time, bodily return of the Lord, physical resurrection, day of judgment, and heaven on a renewed earth is so loosely woven that there are many hanging threads. If all are in the prime of youth, I would not recognize my parents and would have some problem with my brother who died at age two. Will the woman who was pregnant at the time of death still be pregnant? Will the person who donated his heart be without one in heaven? What of those plastic joints and metal pins the doctors put in your body? Will these spiritualized fleshly bodies have spiritual clothes or be naked? Why would a spiritual body in a perfect setting need clothing? Will there be eternal spiritual cotton, wool, linen,

or Dacron for clothing? Will one outfit serve eternally, or will God provide a new suit for each day? All of the millions of innocent aborted babies and those millions who died in infancy whose mothers were unsaved – who will be caring for them? Will those who died in infancy be made to comprehend all things in heaven and able to converse in an unlearned language? Will they grow into adulthood there?

We look forward to those family reunions. My wife and I will want to be together with our kids -- while our kids will want to be with their spouses and kids -- and their children will want to be with their spouses and children, and so with all the descendants and ancestors. Some men will have more than one wife because of widows marrying widows and some men will have to share a wife with another man or two whom she married after he/they died. Being earthly, we can form no concepts except through physical senses, so the writers used physical terminology and literal descriptions to describe the spiritual relationship of the redeemed now and hereafter. Eternal relationship with God is spiritual and cannot be a place located in space.

If you still have questions, maybe a review of the eleven previous articles relating to this subject may clarify some of them.
