Hello Cecil, My name is Sandy and I am a sister in Cincinnati, OH. I am rereading your book "Free In Christ" which is exactly what I've needed. I am thoroughly enjoying it as well as being challenged by your book. I am convicted by all the legalism and potential legalism that is in my walk with the Lord.

I actually was converted in a main-line (traditional) church of Christ in 1980. Then from 1981 -2002 I was part of the International churches of Christ. Have you heard of it? Well if you have then you know all the good, bad and ugly of it all. I learned so many phenomenal things while in this ministry such as learning the Scriptures, evangelizing and studying the Bible to help people come to a faith and become a baptized believer (disciple/Christian) and help "teach them to obey everything". I won't deny that there were some very wrong teachings and wrong use of authority etc.....so there is joy and pain as I look back over the 22 years in that ministry.

My family and I are now a part of a "main-line/progressive" church of Christ and the people are very, very loving. So...from all that I know...their belief is the prayer (sinner's prayer) is when they cross over from darkness to light, whereas the Scriptures clearly teach that when our sins are forgiven that is the point in time we cross from darkness to light. Fellow brothers/sisters won't say "they are lost" or need the gospel.....they've been baptized and it isn't up to them to judge.
